<i>In order to maintain current rates of staffing with expected population growth, we would need to increase anticipated training and recruitment pipelines in FTEs by¹:</i>		
Nurses ¹²	+ 8,000	<i>~ 18% on top of current pipeline</i>
Midwives	+ 250	<i>~ 12% on top of current pipeline</i>
Doctors (incl. GPs)	+ 3,400	<i>~14% on top of current pipeline</i>
Pharmacists	+ 570	<i>~15% on top of current pipeline</i>
Sonographers	+ 50	<i>~ 9% on top of current pipeline</i>
Anaesthetic technicians	+ 30	<i>~ 3% on top of current pipeline</i>
